MPC GUEST MISSIONARIES AT A GLANCE

WHO TRAVELS WITH MPC? Groups ranging from 5 – 50 individuals. These may be congregations, schools, medical school families, athletic teams, professional groups, etc. Mission team volunteers must be at least 16 unless traveling with parents.

WHEN AND ARE TRIPS AND FOR HOW LONG? Mission trips are available year-round. Trip length can vary, but most trips, including travel, are eight days (Saturday to Saturday). We have trips to Jinotega, Nicaragua, and The School of the Good Samaritan in Catacamas, Honduras. In Nicaragua, you fly into Managua (MGA) and travel north approximately 2 ½ to Jinotega; in Honduras, you fly into Tegucigalpa/Comayagua (XPN) and travel east approximately 4 hours to Catacamas. The mission also has a school in duty in Haiti, and plans are for trips there in the future. We have been developing the group since 1998. The mission opened in October of 1997.

WHAT IS THE COST? The cost of participating in a mission trip with Misión Para Cristo is \$725 - \$775 per person, depending on the country visited, covering all costs except airfare. There is also a request of \$1,500 to \$3,000 (depending on the group size) per group to help cover project materials. There is a fun day set for each group with different options. The typical cost of the day is \$30.

WHERE DO WE STAY? In Nicaragua, MPC has housing that can sleep our groups and where we provide all your meals during your week. In Honduras, we stay in hotels and eat at the school, hotel, and other restaurants. Upon arrival/departure from Nicaragua, we stay at the Best Western Las Mercedes Hotel; in Honduras, lodging varies when entering the country (depending on your arrival time), and we stay at the Juan Carlos Hotel in Catacamas.

HOW DO VOLUNTEERS SERVE? You will be working side-by-side with mission staff in Jinotega, Nicaragua, or Catacamas, Honduras, on projects they have chosen to help make a difference, but mainly for you to touch the person God puts in front of you. The type of work done while with us will vary depending on individuals' skills and preferences. Most of our teams work in building homes, digging wells, building latrines, building water filters for homes, planting gardens, school additions, locations for location congregations, room additions, and other projects to improve residents' quality of life and health. You will also be able to include a spiritual component to your trip by putting together Bible Adventures (VBS) and Mobile Library for the children in the schools, Kingdom Kids, the congregations, and communities where the mission is working. Medical teams are also developed throughout the year to serve the medical needs of the people, and some medical members work in our full-time medical clinic in Nicaragua. (Medical teams are asked to help with the cost of the medicine and mobile clinics). Also, the ladies go to Casa Materna, where ladies come from the rural mountain area of Nicaragua, to be close to medical care and have their babies. Those who sponsor children in Kingdom Kids get to visit and have time with their sponsored children.

WHO DO WE WORK WITH? Our staff meets your group at the airport; someone is with you throughout your trip. Volunteers often find that seeing through the eyes of their new Central American friends is the most meaningful aspect of their journey, and many of these relationships continue year after year. The mission has a limited North American staff, and most days, you will work side by side with Nicaraguans or Hondurans.

WHAT IS THE IMPACT ON VOLUNTEERS? Our guest missionaries are encouraged and challenged through their trip experience in ways as diverse as the individuals themselves. No matter the lesson learned, participants return energized with a passion for serving and sharing the Gospel through service. You never go home the same.
